If you, or a member of your family, have a disability, we offer three core services:

Information and Referral

We provide information about a wide variety of issues and disabilities or direct you to the resources you need for services or additional information. We also have an extensive lending library with topics ranging from education to health issues. This library is available to the public so you, or your child's educators and health professionals are welcome to make use of it.

Education and Training

Workshops are coordinated and presented on topics relevant to the issues facing persons with disabilities and their families. Call our office today for topics, times and locations and sign up for our newsletter for future workshop schedules and other information.

Family to Family Support

We will link you to a volunteer family that has a similar experience or situation to provide emotional support, specific information and guidance. Our Family to Family Support program is a volunteer mentorship program to help you through a difficult time or just provide guidance in having a family member with a certain type of disability.

FHF of GBR Programs

Early Childhood Supports and Services (ECSS)

A project which encompasses those families who reside within EBR. One of the goals of this initiative is to develop a local integrated, comprehensive system of care for children up to 5 years of age and their families.

Children's Special Health Services Parent Liaison (CSHS)

Provides information, referral, education, training and one to one support to families enrolled in Children's Special Health Services.

Office for Citizen's with Developmental Disabilities OCDD - Early Steps Community Outreach Specialist (COS)

Provides information and training about Early Steps, Families Helping Families and other community supports and services as well as one to one parent support in hospital rooms, clinics, headstarts and daycare centers or other settings for children from birth to 3 years of age.

Inclusive Education (SDE)

The education of all students in regular education and community settings to ensure full and valued memberships in society.

- *Provides workshops and presentations*
- *Provides one to one support*
- *Attends IEP and other education related meetings*

Transition Facilitator (SDE)

Staff works with families and professionals to help train, educate and empower them to develop an Individualized Transition Plan that will help students reach their full potential.

LA Citizens for Action Now (LaCAN)

A statewide grassroots network of individuals and families advocating for a service system that supports individuals with disabilities to live in their own homes, rather than having to move to a facility to receive needed services.

Louisiana's Parent Training & Information Center (PTI)

A program to provide advocacy and training for families of students at risk as well as students who receive special education and related services.

Self Advocacy

A self advocate can lead other individuals to confidently assert their rights and handle their responsibilities. Self advocates share available information and resources which can help others become more independent. Self advocacy is about people with disabilities working to take charge of their own lives.
